THE CZECH PHILHARMONIC ORCHESTRA


The first concert ever of the Czech Philharmonic Orchestra took place on 4 January 1896 at the Rudolfinum, and was conducted by Antonín Dvořák himself. The internationally acclaimed conductor Václav Talich became the principal conductor in 1919, and was proceeded by Ludvík Čelanský and Vilém Zemánek, briefly also Oskar Nedbal. Talich was succeeded by other top-notch conductors including: Rafael Kubelík (1942–1948), Karel Ančerl (1950–1968) and Václav Neumann (1968–1990). During the 1990s the principal directors included: Jiří Bělohlávek, Gerd Albrecht and Vladimir Askhkenazy who headed the orchestra until the close of the 2002/2003 season. The tenth principal conductor of the Czech Philharmonic Orchestra, Zdeněk Mácal, has been there from the 2003/2004 season until 8 September 2007.

is a leading Czech ensemble with a history of more than 70 years performing symphonic concerts in Smetana Hall in the Municipal House and concerts of chamber music at the Church of Sts. Simon and Jude. The FOK abbreviation stands for the former performances of the orchestra during their first years (film – opera – koncert). The Symphony Orchestra's principal conductor from the 2006/2007 season is Jiří Kout.

BLACK LIGHT THEATRE

The black light theatre phenomenon is a vital part of Prague and its cultural scene. Even though the principle of black light theatre was known to the ancient Chinese, its rebirth on the international stage took place in the 1960s, in large part thanks to Jiří Srnec and his theatre group, who introduced it in full-feature form to international audiences. At present, Prague has possibly the largest number of black light theatres in the world, offering a vast repertoire to choose from.





Undoubtedly, the Křižík Fountain is a unique sight here in Europe. It was designed and constructed in the late 19th century by the Czech engineer and inventor František Křižík. It offers a rare artistic experience where music, water and light effects dance together as one. There are numerous water circuits controlled by 50 pumps with over 3000 jets. The effects are created by 1248 underwater reflectors especially visible at night. The pool is 25 x 45 meters and holds 1650 cubic meters of water. Sound utilizes 55 electroacoustic emitters. The show is all controlled via computer. The effects, along with the music from classical and contemporary composers, provide an amazing experience. The adjacent walls of the surrounding pavilions form an open-air theater for 6000 spectators.

LIGHTS AND SHADOWS OF VYŠEHRAD EXPERIENCE PROJECT

The project brings the mystical place of Vyšehrad to life... Fantasy and imagination will be brought to life by film and dramatic elements utilizing music, fine-art images, architecture and dance. The multi-genre form brings to life images inspired by the

history and legend of Vyšehrad. The project utilizes current trends in dance and motion theatre, combined with new technologies as well as traditional dramatics of the story.

"This is not a traditional dance performance for a specific audience. Lights and Shadows of Vyšehrad is an experience project. We would like to present each Vyšehrad visitor with the atmosphere and history of this historic monument. We strive to not only tell the story but also utilize artistic and dance stylization by combining live actors onstage with pre-shot choreographies and film poetics, whose new forms we are searching for," said Lucie Poláčková, author and choreographer of the project.



"We also emphasize the manner in which we introduce Vyšehrad. The basis for us is the impressive architecture and atmosphere which change according to the time of day and the season. Vyšehrad becomes a decoration at times, and a part of the choreography, interaction and dialogue at other times," explains Poláčková. In addition to the visual side of the project, during the preparation, we focused on the audio atmosphere, including sound effects and original music. Everything has been prepared utilizing the new possibilities surround sound brings to our production.


Music

"There are over 45 minutes of music in this grand romantic symphony. I wanted to give the music in the Lights and Shadows of Vyšehrad largely symphonic character. I have attempted to utilize the language of music which would be understandable to people who do not necessarily come to seek music exclusively, but rather for a complete audiovisual experience. Thanks to a close connection with images, the Lights and Shadows is also close to

film music," says Lukáš Hurník, musical composer for the project. The author consistently utilizes the possibilities of surround sound, not just sound effects, but also the symbolic elements of the story. Surround sound expresses the force of destiny which sweeps over us, a flight through the gate of time, the grandeur of the gothic cathedral... It combines electronic music with live musicians, choirs and solo vocals. The performance also encompasses quotes from the works of Czech composers: Vítězslav Novák, Bedřich Smetana, Josef Suk and Antonín Dvořák. Discover the hidden face of Vyšehrad through this unique project!


